We're so happy you're here. Enjoy *The Mountaintop*!



INGREDIENTS:


- 1.5oz vodka



Additional professional directing credits include productions in New York, Texas, Toronto, Tennessee, North Carolina, Kentucky, Vermont, and Florida. A member of Actors' Equity, Be has performed for several Shakespeare companies. Her voice-over and commercial credits include KFC, Wycliffe, Disney, Thrifty Car Rental, Belk, Zora's Roots (Zora Neale Hurston documentary), Food Lion, and The Gallery series. A member of the Dramatists Guild, she was commissioned by Orlando Rep to create a script about the Ocoee massacre. SUZANNE CLEMENT JONES (Stage Manager) has been stage managing at PBD since All My Sons in 2011, the company's first production at the Don & Ann Brown Theatre, Recent shows for PBD include Dangerous Instruments, Camping with Henry and Tom, The Humans, The Dresser, and Lost in Yonkers. Suzanne is also a lighting designer, whose productions include The Subject was Roses, The Price, and That Championship Season at PBD; Cane and The Cha-Cha of a Camel Spider at Florida Stage; Death and the Maiden and The Birds at Mosaic Theatre; and Ring of Fire at Arts Garage. She earned a Carbonell Award for her lighting design of Dark Rapture in 1995. Suzanne has an MFA in design from Northwestern University, is proud to be a member of Actors' Equity Association, and is presently leading the South Florida Equity community.

NIKOLAS SERRANO (Scenic Design,

ROGER ARNOLD (Sound Design) is

PBD's production manager. He has been a freelance sound engineer and designer for 40 years. He is a voting member of both NARAS (the Grammys) and the Audio Engineering Society. Roger was an educator of music technology and was senior technology professor at the University of New Haven for 12 years. In 2019 he became the sound engineer and resident sound designer for PBD. His credits include Dangerous Instruments, Camping with Henry and Tom, The Humans, The Dresser, Lost in Yonkers, Trying, Death of a Salesman, The Cancellation of Lauren Fein. The Messenger, Lobby Hero, Topdog/ Underdog, August: Osage County, The Science of Leaving Omaha, Twelve Angry Men, 4000 Miles, The Belle of Amherst, Intimate Apparel, The Duration, Almost, Maine, The People Downstairs, and Skylight, as well as PBD's Academy productions. ADAM J. THOMPSON (Projection

Design) is PBD's resident projection designer. He is the recipient of the 2023 USITT and Live Design Rising Star Award, recognizing early career excellence, innovation, and artistic achievement

in the field of design. Adam was an invited ambassador to and exhibitor at the 2018 Beijing International Design Biennial, and he founded and served as the producing artistic director of The Deconstructive Theatre Project from 2006-2016.
